**CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION – The following conditions shall be in effect for this competition:**

- In Sectional Qualifying and in the Championship proper, the player's clubs must conform to the groove specifications in the Rules of Golf that are effective from January 1, 2010. Note: Ping EYE2 clubs manufactured prior to April 1990, may not be used during Sectional Qualifying or the Championship proper. The condition of competition is available for review on the entry application.

The USGA and R&A have created a reference called the Informational Club Database to assist golfers in determining whether their irons, hybrids and fairway woods comply with the New Groove Rules. For information about and to access the database, please use the following link: <http://www.usga.org/InfoClubsDB/intro.html> Additionally, for information regarding the conformance status of clubs not listed, please contact the USGA Research and Test Center at (908) 234-2300.

The USGA strongly suggests that all players verify the compliance of their clubs well in advance of their scheduled qualifying competition. It is the player's responsibility, not the USGA's responsibility to ensure that her clubs conform. Waiting until the day of the competition is the fault of the player. The Committee is under no obligation to test the club. The competitor may play. However, if it is later determined that the club is non-conforming, including after the competition has closed, the player will be disqualified.

- GSGA competitions are "spikeless" events. Therefore, metal and traditionally-designed spikes are prohibited. Penalty for breach of this condition is disqualification.
- Amateur players are responsible for posting their scores to the handicap system upon conclusion of this competition. Scores must be posted as tournament scores. Course slope and rating information is typically posted at the scoreboard during the competition. You may also contact GSGA for this information. Your scores are subject to review by your peers and your club's handicap committee.

**FORMAT / QUALIFYING PLACES:** The field of 78 players will compete over 36 holes for a number of qualifying places and alternate positions to be determined for the 2012 U.S. Women's Open Championship, to be played July 5-8 at Blackwolf Run in Kohler, WI.

**PRACTICE ROUNDS:** Practice rounds will be available based on club availability on the dates and times listed below. Players **MUST** call the golf shop at (770) 394-1928 to make arrangements for a starting time. Only one practice round per player will be allowed, and practice rounds will be limited to contestants only. Practice round cart and range fee is \$25.00 and must be paid regardless of whether the player walks or uses a cart. **Credit cards or cash** will be accepted for cart and range fees.

- May 8-11 and 15-18, anytime based on availability
- Sunday, May 20 after 2:00 p.m.

**PRACTICE ON COURSE:** PROHIBITED. Players are asked to play one ball during practice round. Players shall not play more than one ball to a green.

**CADDIES:** Caddies are not available at Dunwoody Country Club. A player may provide her own caddie. A player is not required to employ a caddie for any stage of the Championship.

**CARTS:** Carts will be available for persons transporting players' bags on May 21. Cart rental fee is \$25.00. Credit cards or cash will be accepted.

**FOOD SERVICE:** Food and beverage service will be available beginning at 7:00 a.m. in the turn stand on the day of qualifying. **CASH ONLY** will be accepted in the turn stand. A lunch buffet will be available in the grill just off the patio by the scoreboard for the players, caddies and guests between the morning and afternoon qualifying rounds. **CASH ONLY** will be accepted.

**GOLF SHOP/DRIVING RANGE:** The golf shop and driving range will open one hour prior to the first starting time on the day of the qualifying rounds.

**STARTING TIMES:** Players may check the GSGA website ([www.gsga.org](http://www.gsga.org)) to obtain their starting times or call GSGA at (770) 955-4272 or (800) 949-4742.

**PREFERRED LIES:** Per the United States Golf Association, for all USGA championship and qualifying rounds the following policy is in effect: A Local Rule authorizing "Preferred Lies" or "Winter Rules" is **NEVER** permitted.

**RULES OF PLAY/PACE OF PLAY POLICIES:** The GSGA Rules of Play and Pace of Play Policies shall be in effect. They can be found under the competitions menu tab at [www.gsga.org](http://www.gsga.org)

**PERSONAL APPEARANCE:** Contestants must be neat in appearance. Bermuda length shorts may be worn. Short shorts, tee shirts, tank tops and blue jeans are prohibited.

Play is governed by the 2012-15 USGA Rules of Golf and its Decisions and, where applicable, by the following Local Rules, Conditions, and Definitions, subject to changes or amendments by the Georgia State Golf Association Rules Committee. Appendix I refers to the Appendix of Local Rules and Conditions of the Competition in the 2012-15 Rules of Golf Book.

Unless otherwise specified, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule or Condition is two strokes in Stroke Play and loss of hole in Match Play.

**1 - LISTS OF CONFORMING GOLF BALLS/DRIVER HEADS:** Optional conditions as prescribed in Appendix I is in effect, pages 137-138.

**2 - LIMITATION ON GOLF BALLS ("ONE-BALL RULE"):** Optional condition as prescribed in Appendix I is in effect, pages 138-139.

**3 - TRANSPORTATION:** Optional condition as prescribed in Appendix I is in effect, page 142.

**4 - FOOTWEAR:** It is a condition of all USGA qualifying events that shoes with traditionally-designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) or spikes, regardless of design, comprised either entirely or partially of metal (if such metal may come in contact with the course) are prohibited during the stipulated round. Penalty: DISQUALIFICATION.

**5 - OFFICIAL TIME:** The official time is located only at the starting tees.

**6 - OUT OF BOUNDS:** Where white stakes or fence posts are used, the nearest inside points at ground level define out of bounds. When out of bounds is defined by a white line on the ground, the line itself is out of bounds. A ball coming to rest on or crossing any public road is considered out of bounds, even if it comes to rest on another part of the golf course.

**7 - WATER HAZARDS:** Defined by yellow lines and designated by yellow stakes. When both stakes and lines are present, the stakes identify the hazard and the lines define the margin.

**8 - LATERAL WATER HAZARDS:** Defined by red lines and designated by red stakes. When both stakes and lines are present, the stakes identify the hazard and the lines define the margin.

**9 - GROUND UNDER REPAIR:** Enclosed white line areas define ground under repair. The white lines are considered in ground under repair. Other areas of ground under repair, even though not so marked include:

- a. French drains (trenches filled with small stones or the like).
- b. Fire ant beds and mounds.
- c. Seams of cut turf: The local rule as prescribed in Appendix I is in effect, page 129.

**10 - IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS; WHITE LINES:** White-lined areas tying into immovable obstructions are part of the obstruction, thus not ground under repair.

**11 - LIFTING AN EMBEDDED BALL:** The "EMBEDDED BALL RULE" as written in Appendix I, page 127 is in effect "through the green."

**12 - TURF PLUGS/WILT WATCH HOLES ON PUTTING GREENS:** On putting greens, in addition to Rule 16-1c, turf plugs/wilt watch holes of any size may be repaired.

**13 - INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE:** Includes cables, rods, wires or wrappings when closely attached to trees; and artificial walls and pilings when located in hazards. No relief without penalty.

**14 - DROPPING ZONES:** A "dropping zone" is an area enclosed by a white line having the initials "DZ" printed inside it. A "dropping zone" is not ground under repair. The line itself is in the "dropping zone."

**15 - STAKED TREES:** If lie of ball, stance, and/or area of intended swing is interfered with by the stake attached to a tree, the stake and/or rope/wire is treated as an Immovable Obstruction. Relief without penalty from the tree itself is not permitted.

**16 - TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS:** See Appendix I, pages 131-134 (includes obstructions installed for the competition and fans).

**17 - ELEVATED OVERHEAD POWER LINES AND CABLES:** If a ball strikes such a line or cable, the stroke shall be cancelled and the ball MUST be replayed, without penalty in accordance with Rule 20-5. If a ball is not immediately recoverable, another ball may be substituted.

**18 - SIGNALS FOR SUSPENSION AND RESUMPTION OF PLAY:**

1. **Dangerous Situation:** One prolonged note of siren or air horn and/or verbal notification by an official.  
"When play is suspended for a dangerous situation, if the players in a match or a group are between the play of two holes, they shall not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they are in the process of playing a hole, they shall discontinue play immediately and shall not thereafter resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play." All practice areas shall be closed during suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open for use. Penalty: DISQUALIFICATION.
2. **Suspend Play:** Three consecutive notes of siren or air horn, repeated.
3. **Resume Play:** Two short notes of siren or air horn, repeated.

**19 - RESULT OF THE COMPETITION:** When all the scores have been posted on the official scoreboard and approved by the Georgia State Golf Association Rules Committee, the result of the competition is deemed to have been officially announced.



**Pace of Play Policy**

Rule 6-7 states, in part: "The player shall play without undue delay in accordance with any pace of play guidelines which may be laid down by The Committee," and thereafter prescribes penalties for slow play. In order to prevent any such penalty, we suggest that you review carefully the following guidelines:

**Definition of "Out of Position"**

The **first group** (each side; both morning and afternoon "waves") to start will be considered out of position if, at any time during the round, the group is behind the prescribed schedule as detailed on the players scorecard and/or the addendum to the rules of play sheet.

Any **subsequent group** will be considered out of position if it is (a) behind the prescribed schedule **and** (b) reaches a **par-3** hole that is open and free of play or reaches a **par-4** or **par-5** hole and any player has not made a stroke from the teeing ground before the hole is open and free of play. Both (a) and (b) must apply for a group to be out of position.

**Group Out of Position**

If a group (stroke play) or match (match play) is out of position, a GSGA Rover will monitor it. **A group or match will be notified when they are being timed.**

**Timing**

A group or match may be monitored or timed for compliance with this pace of play guideline if it is "out of position." When a group or match is "out of position" a player in the group or match is expected to play a stroke within 40 seconds. *The timing of a player's stroke will begin when he has had **reasonable** opportunity to reach his ball, it is his turn to play, and he can play without interference or distraction.*

Except on the putting green, if a player has reached his ball, it is his turn to play, and there are no distractions, timing will begin after he has had **reasonable** time to select his club. Time spent walking backward or forward for determining yardages will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, timing will begin after a player has been allowed a **reasonable** amount of time to lift, clean, and replace his ball, repair his ball mark and other ball marks on his line of putt, and remove loose impediments on his line of putt. Time spent looking at the line from beyond the hole and/or behind the ball will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

**Pace of Play Penalties**

The following are the Stroke and Match Play penalties, in sequence, for any players in a group out of position who take more than 40 seconds to play a stroke when it is his turn to play:

**Stroke Play**

- One bad timing of more than 40 seconds - warning
- A second bad timing - 1-stroke penalty
- A third bad timing - Additional warning and 2-stroke penalty
- A fourth bad timing - Disqualification

**Match Play**

- One bad timing of more than 40 seconds - Warning
- A second bad timing - Loss of hole
- A third bad timing - Additional warning and loss of hole
- A fourth bad timing - Disqualification

**NOTE: If the group or match in question regains its proper position, any previous timings of more than 40 seconds will be carried over for the remainder of that round or match in the event that the group or match requires additional monitoring.**

**Rulings or Other Incidents**

If a ruling or some other legitimate delay occurs which causes the group in question to lose its position, that group is expected to regain its position within a **reasonable** time.
